- **Clinical experience in general practice, emergency medicine, specialty medicine, and exotic animal medicine** — the day-to-day reality of caring for patients across a wide spectrum of species and conditions
- **Continuing education courses and conferences** — ongoing professional development that keeps knowledge current and evidence-based
- **Professional mentorship from veterinarians and specialists** — the guidance of experienced clinicians whose lessons shaped how we approach medicine
- **Veterinary textbooks** — foundational references across internal medicine, surgery, emergency care, pharmacology, nutrition, and exotic medicine
- **Peer-reviewed scientific literature** — primary research papers and systematic reviews that form the evidence base of modern veterinary medicine

XVC educational materials are reviewed and updated as the field evolves, and we are committed to correcting information that is superseded by better evidence.

■ **Science should always remain open to refinement.** We hold our conclusions with appropriate confidence — strongly where evidence is clear, cautiously where it is incomplete, and humbly where honest uncertainty remains. We will never pretend the science is more settled than it is, and we will always update when the evidence requires it.
